### **Guidelines for the manuscript**

- A4 size paper
- Use MS Word (6.0 or later version)
- The Title of the Paper in bold face, Times new roman 12 point font upper case (capital) letters
- The page margins should be 1.5” for left margin and 1” for all other margins
- The names of authors should be in Times New Roman 12 point font regular upper case letters
- Use regular italics for author affiliations
- Address(s) of author(s): The address of the institute where the work has been carried out should be clearly stated. In case the work has been carried out in several institutes / Departments, the addresses should be numbered using a superscript at the start of each author’s name.
- Single line space between title and names of authors and between names of authors and their affiliations.
- Two-line spaces before typing the Abstract.
- Text of the abstract should be limited to 500 words in 12 point regular font with single line spacing
- The abstract should not be more than three pages with specified page margins.

### Abstract

The extended abstract of your research has to be submitted via web page of the BCAS according to the guide lines provided. This is the 5<sup>th</sup> conference conducted by the BCAS on Multidisciplinary research 2020. Kindly use this camera ready template in preparing your abstract. You do not need any formatting. For the extended abstract you need about 500 maximum number of word count. The entire length of the extended abstract should be less than three pages. Please register through the webpage prior to submit your abstract Then upload the abstract. Once the abstract is accepted by the editorial board, you can register by transferring the registration fees. The guide lines for registration is given in the BCAS web page. Make sure that you are uploading the camera ready copy into the system. The extended abstract should contain an introduction, with the objectives, methodology, results, discussion and a conclusion(s) without subheadings or references. There should be only five key words. Please enter your key words, one line below the abstract.

### INTRODUCTION

Write introduction to your research with objectives. Define abbreviations and acronyms at the first time they appear in the text.

### BACKGROUND/LITERATURE SURVEY

Write the background and/or briefing related research work.

### RESEARCH METHODOLOGY / MATERIALS AND METHODS

Brief your adopted research methodology and used materials.

### RESULTS & DISCUSSION

Describe your results with figures and tables. Refer to figures & tables in the text. Discuss the results clearly with relevant references.

### Units

Use SI units.

## Equations

Your equation should be typed using the Symbol font. Each symbol should be described.

## CONCLUSION/FURTHER WORK

It is expected to wrap-up your manuscript with concluding remarks with respect to set objectives of your work and future directions of your contribution.

Use latest Harvard format throughout the reference list.
